A **Display** screen contains no exam items. Typical examples of display screens include Welcome screens or section introduction screens. You are not required to perform any action on a display screen except to click the **Next** button in the lower right corner to proceed to the next screen in the sequence.



Getting Started > Beginning an Exam

The number of display screens and the type of information presented may vary by exam, so make sure you read all of the information carefully and proceed as instructed. Some exams allow you to back up and view a screen you've already seen. Click the **Previous** button to move back one screen.

Certain parts of the exam may be timed. You will be told when you are beginning a timed section, so read the directions carefully.

Before you begin an exam, you may be asked to confirm that you are ready to begin. Clicking the **No** button returns you to the previous screen. Clicking the **Yes** button begins the exam.





Answering Items > Item Screens

Item Screens contain questions that you must answer. The various types of item screens are described later in this tutorial.

Throughout the exam, the exam name and your name display in the upper left corner of the exam.

On every screen of your exam, read all of the information carefully and proceed as instructed.

Answering Items > Time Remaining

At any point in a timed section, you can see how much time you have remaining for that section in the upper right corner of the screen. If you don't want to view the time remaining during an exam, click on the clock icon to hide the time remaining.


When there is less than five minutes remaining for an exam section, the time remaining displays in yellow as a warning that time is about to expire.

When time expires, a warning message appears. Click **OK** to close the warning message. The current section ends and the next section of the exam displays automatically.

Answering Items > Progress Indicator

As you navigate through an exam, you can pace yourself by referring to the **progress indicator** in the upper right corner of the screen. The progress indicator includes the current item number and may include the total number of items in the section. You can collapse and expand the progress indicator by clicking on the progress indicator icon.

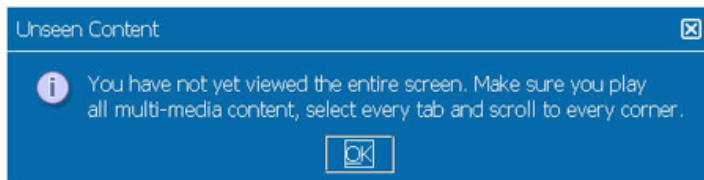

Answering Items > Using the Scroll Bar

Some exam items may not fit on the screen. For these items, a scroll bar appears along the portion of the screen that can be scrolled. To reveal the rest of the item, either use the mouse to click and drag the scroll bars, or click on the arrows on either end of the scroll bar.

For some exams, if you attempt to complete an item without scrolling to the bottom of the screen, a user prompt may appear to remind you to scroll down before completing the item.

To close the user prompt, click **OK** and then scroll down the page to reveal the remainder of the item. Make sure you read all the information carefully and then proceed to the next item.



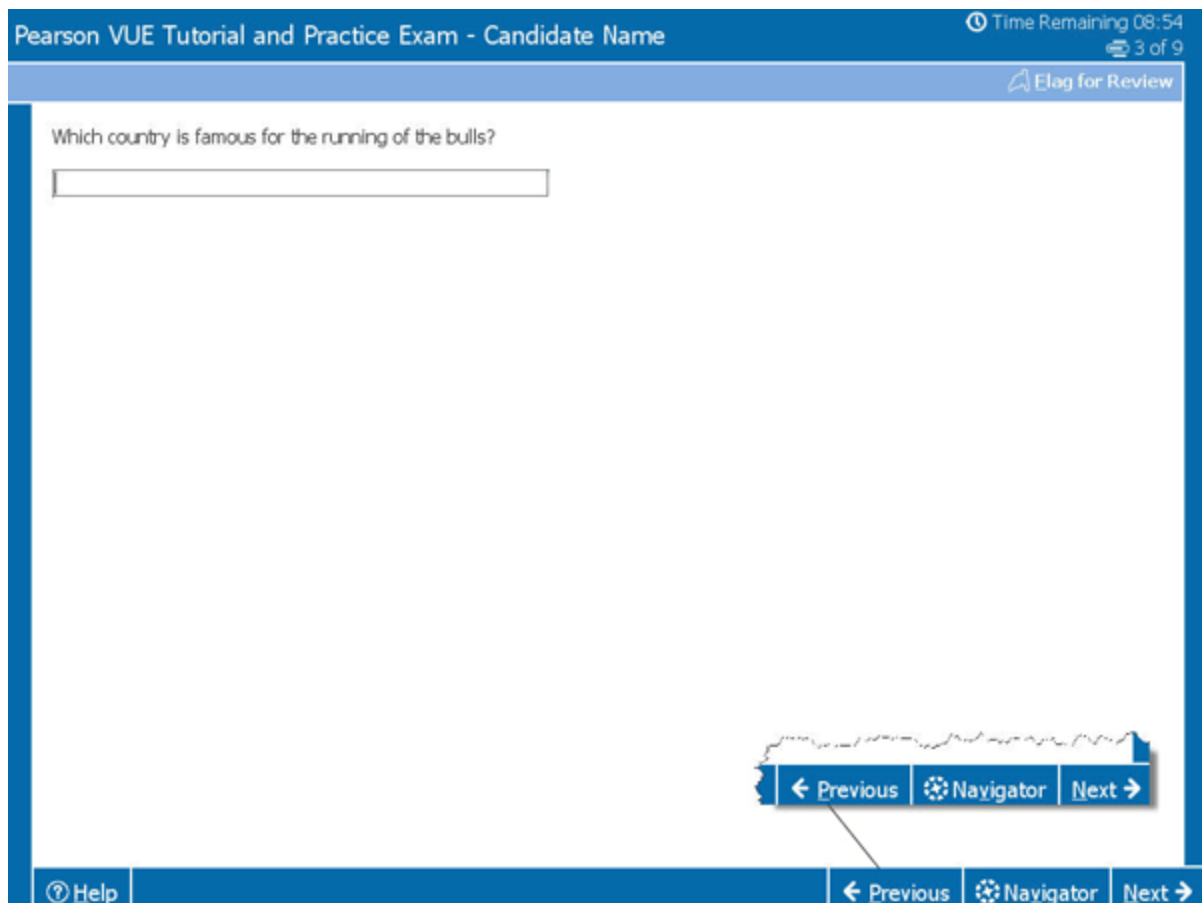

Answering Items > Navigation

Notice the Previous and Next buttons in the bottom right corner of this screen. These buttons are available on most screens throughout your exam. The Next button moves you from the current exam screen to the next screen in the sequence of screens. Some exams allow you to back up and view a screen you've already seen. Click the Previous button to move back one screen.

Buttons can be selected by using either the mouse or a combination of keys on your keyboard. For example, to select the Next button, you can press the **N** key on your keypad while holding down the **Alt** key.

NOTE: The letter underlined on a button indicates the letter you will press (while holding down the Alt key) to select that button.



Answering Items > Navigator Panel

The **Navigator** button in the lower right corner opens a window that allows you to move freely around the exam items within a section. The **Navigator** window also allows you to view the item status, and items that are marked for review.

Items displayed in the Navigator window are sorted by question number. You can sort the questions by Question #, Status, or Flagged for Review by clicking the column heading. Click the heading once to change the current sort order from ascending to descending order; click it again to change from descending to ascending order. An arrow pointing up (▲) indicates that the column is sorted in ascending order; an arrow pointing down (▼) indicates that it is in descending order.



Answering Items > Answering Simple Multiple-Choice Items

There are several ways to mark your answer to a simple multiple-choice item. You may be able to select an answer by clicking on the circle to the left of the answer or by clicking on the answer itself.

Some exams may allow you to answer an item by selecting an answer's corresponding letter or number - this can be done with the mouse or by using keyboard.

Clicking on an answer you have already selected removes the selection and marks it as unanswered.



Answering Items > Answering Drop-down Response Items

Some questions require you to select an answer from a drop-down response of predefined answers. Click on the drop-down arrow and select an item from the list.

Item Review > Flag for Review

Some exams may allow you to flag items that you want to return to later. To flag an item, click the button in the upper right corner labeled **Flag for Review**. If you flag an item for review, a flag appears next to that item on the review screen.

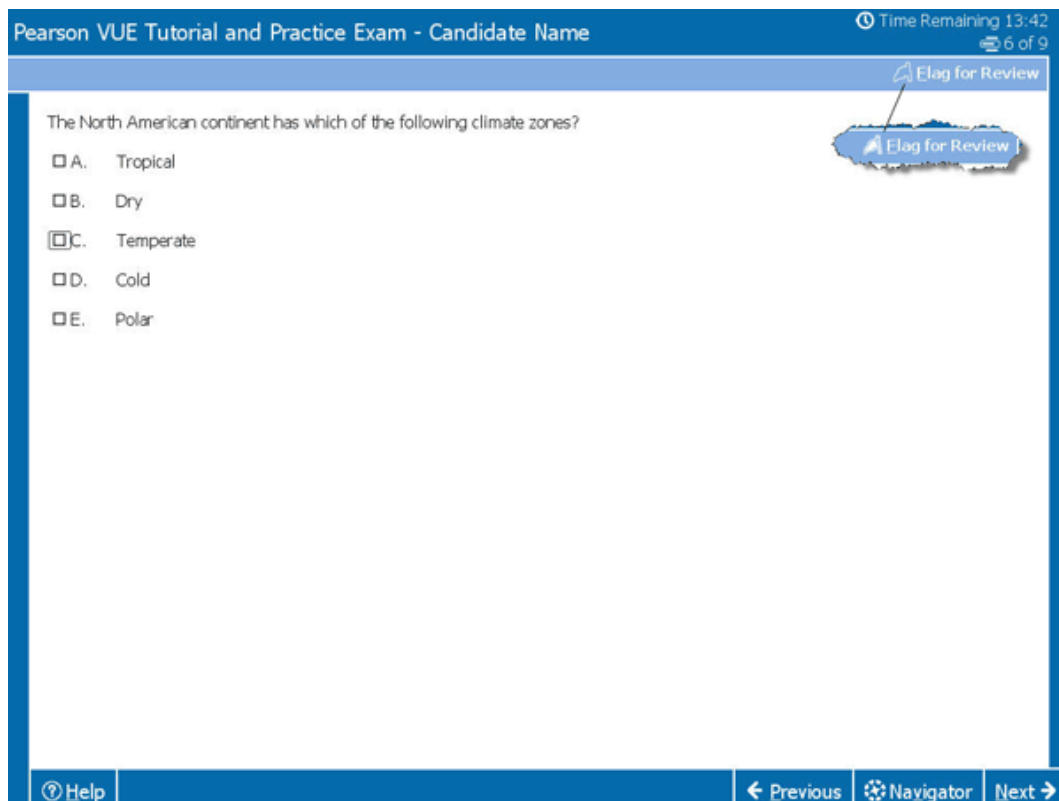
Review of items must be done during the testing time. You can select items for review whether you have answered them or not.

To flag an item for review:

- Use the mouse to click the **Flag for Review** button.
- Use your keyboard and hold down the **Alt** key and press the letter **F**.

A flag image appears within the flag outline when the item has been flagged for review. If you wish to unflag the item, click on the **Flag for Review** button again and the flag image disappears.

When you reach the last item in a section, press the **Next** button to move to the **Review Screen**.



Item Review > Using the Review Screen

Some exams allow you to review items at the end of a section. When item review is allowed, the **Item Review Screen** automatically displays at the end of the section.

Blue bars label the different areas of the review screen. The name of the exam section appears on the left of a bar, while the total number of items in the section and the number of incomplete items in that section appear on the right of the bar. Click on the plus sign to the left of the section name to reveal a list of items in that section.

If you checked the **Flag for Review** button on an item screen, a flag appears beside that item on the **Item Review Screen**. In this example, questions 5 and 6 were flagged for review. Unanswered items are displayed as **Incomplete**.

From the **Item Review Screen** you can review items in a number of ways. The following buttons are available on the **Item Review Screen**:

Review All – Click to review all the items and answers in the section.

Review Incomplete – Review only the items that were left incomplete.

Review Flagged – Review the items that are flagged for review.

You can select or deselect additional items to be flagged by clicking on the flag outline to the left of the item number.

If your exam has item review, a **Review Screen** button may appear on each screen of the section in review mode. When this button is provided you can access the Review Screen at any time during the section.

Item Review > Ending Review

If your exam has item review, select the **End Review** button in the lower left corner of the **Item Review Screen** to exit that section. Select **Yes** to end the review or **No** to stay in the review screen so you can navigate back to your flagged questions. Once you end the review, you can no longer go back and review or change your responses for that section. Make sure you read all screen instructions carefully!
